

# Greetings from the President Susan Krumm



Here is where the tour will take you. You have the entire month of October to complete the ten sites and turn in your selfies. Deadline is Tuesday, October 31, at midnight. **Wednesday, September 27, 2023, 6:30 p.m. with Dr. David Schmidt**, professor at Westminster College; session at the Historical Society Research Center. Dr. Schmidt will discuss finding "Shady" in South Dakota, the excavation, retrieval and history of searching for a dinosaur. He will have sample bones and photos of the site and answer questions regarding the species and time period of existence.



### The Mule Industry in Callaway County



**Monday, October 2, 2023, 1:30 p.m. with Dr. Robert Barnett** (veterinarian) and **Tony Michelle** (mule breeder); session at Historical Society Research Center. Learn some of the history of mules in Callaway County as well as current breeding and care. In the late 1800's and early 1900's Callaway was called the mule capital of the world. Mules were shipped from McCredie and many went to the Army for their use.

### Ruth Harris, Educational Leader, Harris-Stowe Teacher's College

**Tuesday, October 10, 2023, 1:30 p.m. with Vanessa Garry**, Associate Professor in the College of Education at the University of Missouri – St. Louis. In 1940, St. Louis Public Schools named Dr. Ruth Harris, the first African American female President of the Harris-Stowe State University. Ruth helped pave the way for future leaders in education. Hear her story from a current educator.

### The Outhouse – History, Hype and Humor

**Friday, October 13, 2023, 2:00 p.m. Join Tom Jones** at Auto World Museum to hear the lore and construction of outhouses. See examples of brick, two story and frame structures. Hear the stories about school "facilities", and hear the fears (snakes, wasps, etc.). All told with humor!

### Jesse Howard, Folk Artist

**Monday, November 6, 2023; 1:30 p.m. Join Tanna Schmidli and Lynda Crump** at the Historical Society Museum to view the Jesse Howard display and learn about his signs and art work from two of his grandchildren. His work is in the Smithsonian and also collected by local residents.

or at the cemetery that day. Tickets for the tour are \$10 each and tours are approximately 45-50 minutes long. Tours are limited to 30 people each time. There will be limited seating on straw bales. Please wear sturdy shoes as the ground in the cemetery is fairly uneven.

Some of the early pioneers you will 'meet' include: **Col. Thomas Smith**, who founded Smith's Landing, a very early settlement on the river; **William Nash Moore**, a farmer, carpenter, and local historian; **Patrick Ewing**, a veteran of two wars, who will share tidbits of his life; the **Ramsey family**, both black and white members, will be highlighted; and the third wife of **Henry Holman**, **Nancy Nash Holman**, will enlighten you on their story. Others buried



there will be highlighted by a narrator and information is included in the program booklet.

Join us for an informative afternoon in the cemetery and then enjoy some great refreshments! Our thanks to Mokane, Mokane Christian Church and the Community Fellowship Church for their assistance. # The Callaway County Poor Farm

### Yes, we really did have one!

The Callaway County Poor Farm was located near Ham's Prairie from the late 1870's through 1957. The original farm was 320 acres, in a 'high state of cultivation.' Crops included wheat, oats, corn, timothy and vegetables. From an 1894 Fulton Gazette we learn, "there are thirty-five people taken care of at the Farm and one only has to visit the place to see that they are all helpless, dependent and deserving. It is a hospital, an asylum and a house of refuge combined."

Early on Callaway County made a commitment to care for those who could not care for themselves and had no funds. The Farm was run by a superintendent and wife who both worked the farm and maintained the living quarters for the inmates. Often residents assisted in the farming and house chores. Oversight by the county was from the Board of Visitors of the County Court.

In 1893, total costs of running the Farm were \$3,076.94; sales from the Farm were 293.80; and the average cost per inmate was \$61.84. With time, the Poor Farm became well-used and rundown. As noted below, a new dormitory was finally constructed in 1905.

Many residents lived their final years on the Poor Farm and were buried there. It is estimated that approximately 200 burials took place. KCHS archival records contain the death certificates of many of them.

### Excerpts from article in The Fulton Gazette—January 10, 1905

This is a picture of the new building at the county farm on Ham's Prairie, which was recently completed. The building is 50 by 84 feet and will comfortably care for fifty people. The first story is built of stone, and the second and third stories are of brick burned on the farm. . . Each story is equipped with semi-detached modern bath rooms, lavatories and closets. The entire building is heated by steam from a specially constructed, detached boiler-house fifty feet in the rear of the main building.



The total cost of the structure, including boiler-house, heating and plumbing, was less than \$10,000. The plans were prepared and the work was supervised by Architect M. F. Bell of Fulton.

The first story of the building contains laundry, large dining room and an extension for negro inmates. The second story has nine rooms, two dormitories, day room, medicine room, etc. and is occupied by male inmates. The third story is for women and is arranged similarly to the second story. Access to the several floors and to the dining room is gained by separate stairways for men and women. A neat portico is provided on the front and a generous covered gallery across the rear of the building adds much to the comfort of the inmates. . . Corridors ten feet wide extend through each story and in them are stationary seats. Currently there are twenty white women and twenty three white men, five negro women and three negro men. This new institution will accommodate about 50 persons without crowding.

This building supersedes all of the old frame buildings that have been used by inmates at the county farm. It is modern in every detail and adds greatly to the comfort and health of the county's poor at the farm. The new structure places Callaway in the front-rank in this kind of charity.

# HOUF FAMILY'S SIX-GENERATION LEGACY HONORED AT CALLAWAY HERITAGE DAY


